Regular **MINUTES** City Council Meeting 7pm, March 25, 2025

Regular City Council Meeting of Pioneer Village held at City Hall 4700 Summitt Drive Louisville, KY 40229. Mayor Gary Hatcher called the meeting to order at 7pm on March 25, 2025.

Council Members present: Peggy Druin, Dorleen Garrett, James Burke, Don Howell and Shane Nichols.

Council Member absent: John Mast.

Also, in attendance: City Attorney Mark Edison, City Clerk Micheale McCauley, Chief JC Witherspoon and the Pioneer News Media.

Invocation by: Chaplain, Joe Wells All recited the Pledge of Allegiance

- ✚ City Clerk McCauley read the regular meeting minutes from February 25, 2025. Don Howell made a motion to accept the regular meeting minutes as read. Shane Nichols 2<sup>nd</sup> the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.
- ✚ Jim Burke made a motion to accept the financial report from February 25, 2025. Peggy Druin 2<sup>nd</sup> the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.

## **OLD BUSINESS**

- ✚ The Mayor reported there were 9 -2<sup>nd</sup> certified delinquent letters mailed on March 6, 2025. The next step is the sale of delinquent taxes next month.
- ✚ Peggy Druin made a motion to remove from the table the 2045 Bullitt County Comprehensive Plan – Goals, Objectives and Future Land Use. Jim Burke 2<sup>nd</sup> the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried. Attorney Edison reported the County needs a plan in place in order to enact regulations. Each City needs to vote on the Plan's goals and objectives. Peggy Druin made a motion to accept the 2045 Bullitt County Comprehensive Plan – Goals, Objectives and Future Land Use. Jim Burke 2<sup>nd</sup> the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.

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## **NEW BUSINESS**

- ✚ The council decided to make the Spring Cleanup Day for the City of Pioneer Village on Saturday April 26, 2025, from 8am to 12pm with the rain date of Saturday May 10, 2025.
- ✚ Attorney Edison explained and read Resolution 2025-01 Opposition of Centralized Collection of Occupational Taxes. Peggy Druin made a motion to accept Resolution 2025-01 Opposition of Centralized Collection of Occupational Taxes. Don Howell 2<sup>nd</sup> the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.

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## **COUNCIL BUSINESS**

- ✚ Peggy Druin said the Walk Park looks great with the addition of the pavilion and sidewalks. She also inquired about what streets will be paved this year. The Mayor said the Meadowbrook subdivision will be paved in the middle of this year.
- ✚ The Mayor reported there are approximately 40 potholes in the City that will be fixed after May.
- ✚ Shane Nichols thanked the Police Department for sitting at the stop signs on Spring Meadow Drive.

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## **POLICE BUSINESS**

- ✚ The February run report had 179 calls for service to the Pioneer Village Police Department.
- ✚ Dorleen Garrett reported there are several people speeding on Cardinal Ave before and after work on a daily basis.

⚡ Chief Witherspoon's report included:

- Each officer has been asked to increase their patrols within the City each day.
- There was only one speeding complaint for the month of February. The speeding complaints on Facebook need to be reported through Dispatch not social media.
- The hot spots for speeding will be monitored more closely on Spring Meadow Dr, Maryville Elementary, Graymont Rd and Ridgemont Rd.

- There was one shots fired call that was unsubstantiated in February.

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## **PUBLIC BUSINESS**


- ⚡ Jim Burke asked about the Community Garden. The Mayor reported the 7 loads of dirt have been delivered and will be spread out in the next few weeks.


