All recited the Pledge of Allegiance

- Lity Clerk McCauley read the regular meeting minutes from April 22, 2025. Jim Burke made a motion to accept the regular meeting minutes with corrections. Dorleen Garrett 2nd the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.
- ♣ Peggy Druin made a motion to accept the financial report from April 30, 2025. Dorleen Garrett 2nd the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.

OLD BUSINESS

- ↓ The Mayor reported there were 3–30-yard dumpsters filled and 1 trailer full of scrap. The Mayor thanked all those who volunteered their time to make the cleanup day a success from 7:30am to 12:00pm.

All were in favor. Motion carried. Plans to pave Meadowbrook subdivision will be in the fall of 2025, along with the purchase of a new outfitted police vehicle.

POLICE BUSINESS

Police run report for April included 321 calls for Service to Pioneer Village Police Dept. PV = 211 calls / HE = 101 calls / Others = 9 calls.

- Chiefs reported an increase in patrols in the City along with increased code enforcement.
- Please read the Fireworks Ordinance 2011-05 for when it is approved to set off fireworks.
- There is a new scam out of Canada with a parking violation using an artificial intelligence voice. Please do not say yes on any call due to them trying to get your voice recorded.
- Attorney Edison said there is also a scam on the Indiana Tolls. The Department of Transportation will send you a bill in the mail but never by email.
- Increased patrols in several subdivisions and streets to catch people speeding and running stop signs.

PUBLIC BUSINESS

- ♣ Alicia Fewell is proposing a 36' x 70' section to be a no-mow zone next to the community garden. There were several Council members concerned about the legal issues that would be in direct conflict with the City ordinances. The Mayor asked Ms. Fewell to mark off the area and he will keep watch. Attorney Edison said this area would create more issues with rodents, skunks and rabbits with any unkept areas.
- Lecil Julian from Hebron Woods reported there are some residents who are not happy with the placement of two new stop signs. There is some issues on Facebook between residents due to the stop signs being placed, the Mayor said that a certain resident has been falsely accused of asking for the stop signs to be placed, which she did NOT. The Mayor informed all that the City controls the easements and roads in Pioneer Village and the stop signs will remain in place. The renovation of the Hebron Woods Entrance work started last Friday. The Mayor told Mr. Julian that the construction company must have traffic control or flaggers.
- ♣ Mike Neal from the SMPH reported that 3 residents fell on the sidewalks in the Patio Homes. The Mayor reported that the City is not responsible for the sidewalk, it is the responsibility of the Homeowners Association.
